**PUBLIC NOTICE TO THE RATEPAYERS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF THE
TOWNSHIP OF WENTWORTH**

To the qualified voters entitled to be entered on the referendum list for the entire territory of the Municipality of the Township of Wentworth regarding the registration procedure.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given as follows:

1. At a meeting held on October 3rd, 2013, Council adopted By-Law Number 102-2-2013 entitled "By-Law Number 102-2-2013 Modifying Zoning By-Law number 102"
2. This by-law is intended to:
 - 2.1 Add provisions applicable to a derogatory main buildings protected by acquired rights concerning the rear setback line for lakefront lots
3. The eligible voters having the right to be entered on the referendum list for the entire territory may request that this By-Law be subjected to a referendum by entering their name, address and capacity by signing a register opened for this purpose (eligible voters wishing to register must enter their names, show an i.d. card with photo: RAMQ, driver's licence or passport);
4. The register will be available on November 5th, 2013, from 9 :00 a.m. to 7 :00 p.m., at the Town Hall located at 114, chemin Louisa;
5. The number of applications required for the By-Law to be subjected to a referendum is 169. If this number is not reached, the By-Law is deemed approved by the qualified voters;
6. The requirements to be entered on the referendum list as a qualified voter are :

- a) Any person who on October 3rd, 2013 or while exercising their right is not disqualified from voting under the law and who meets one of the following two conditions:
- Be a natural person residing on the territory and for at least six months in Québec;
 - Be the owner of an immovable or business establishment occupant for at least 12 months located on the territory.

A natural person must also as of October 3rd, 2013 and at the moment of exercising their right, be 18 years of age, a Canadian citizen and not be under curatorship.

A legal person is entitled to vote and exercise their right by one of its members, directors or employees designated by resolution for that purpose. The designated person must on October 3rd or at the moment of exercising their right:

- Be 18 years old;
 - Be a Canadian citizen;
 - Not be under curatorship; and
 - Not be incapacitated to vote within the parameters of the *Act Respecting Elections and Referendums in Municipalities*.
7. The undivided co-owners of an immovable who are qualified voters, designate a person who is entitled to be entered on the referendum list to sign the application on their behalf by a power of attorney signed by the majority of co-owners.
8. The occupants of a business establishment who are qualified voters designate a person who is entitled to be entered on the referendum list to sign the application of their behalf by a power of attorney signed by the majority of the occupants.
9. The results of the registration procedure will be announced on November 5th, 2013, at 7 p.m. at the Town Hall;
10. The By-Law can be reviewed at the Town Hall located at 114, chemin Louisa, between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. from Monday to Friday or on the website at www.wentworth.ca.
