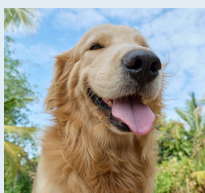

Anyone engaging in soliciting (selling, providing services, or soliciting donations) must hold a valid permit, which must be visibly displayed. Soliciting is permitted only between 10:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. Thank you for your cooperation.

The dog license renewal period is now underway. In the Township of Wentworth, annual dog registration is mandatory. The fee is \$10 per dog (\$5 for a replacement tag). Seasonal residents holding a valid dog license from another municipality in Québec are exempt. **Renewals must be completed by June 3.**

Working together for everyone's safety

From May 3 to 9, 2026, Civil Security Week will be held, under the theme "Acting together for the safety of all".

This week aims to remind everyone that each citizen plays a key role in their own safety, the safety of their family, and the protection of their property. Being well-informed and adequately prepared can make all the difference in an emergency.

To this end, a regulation has just been adopted concerning the composition and internal governance of the Civil Security Committee.

We also take this opportunity to remind the public of the importance of registering for the [Telmatik](#) alert system, in order to quickly receive important messages and notices from the Canton in the event of an emergency.

Off Road Vehicles in Wentworth

The Township of Wentworth is renowned for its trails and forested areas ideal for off-road vehicles. For safe and responsible off-roading, it is important to stay on designated trails and areas, respect all signage, and avoid public roads and private land without permission.

Wearing a helmet, having a valid license, registration, and insurance are mandatory at all times. Adherence to these rules promotes harmonious coexistence and the safety of everyone.

Lyme disease: be vigilant against ticks

Lyme disease is on the rise in Quebec and can pose a risk to people who work or participate in outdoor activities. It is caused by a bacterium transmitted through the bite of a black-legged tick (*Ixodes scapularis*).

The risk of tick bites is present even at temperatures as low as 4°C, especially in wooded areas, tall grass, and gardens, and can cause a circular rash, fatigue, or muscle aches. To protect yourself, use insect repellent, check your body after outdoor activities, and if bitten, remove the tick quickly and call Info-Santé at 811, as early treatment is very effective.

Opening of the Boat wash station

Good news! The boat wash station has been open since May 1, 2026. Its automated system allows for safe use and contributes to the protection of lakes against invasive aquatic species.

Access card required

Annual renewal of the boat launch access card is required at a cost of \$20. A form must be completed beforehand and submitted to the Municipality. Payment can be made in person, by cheque, or through online banking.
