Information session on the Lake Louisa outlet

On June 20th, the Township of Wentworth held an information session on the analysis of the Lake Louisa outlet. Led by Audrey Laflamme of the firm WSP, this meeting provided an opportunity to present to citizens the results of the study of the lake's hydrographic network, as well as the main findings and issues related to managing its water levels.

A reference document on the Lake Louisa hydrographic network has been filed and is now available to the public. The complete video of the meeting is also available online for those who were unable to attend or who wish to review the information presented. You are invited to consult these resources to learn more about the observations, analyses, and recommendations presented at the meeting.

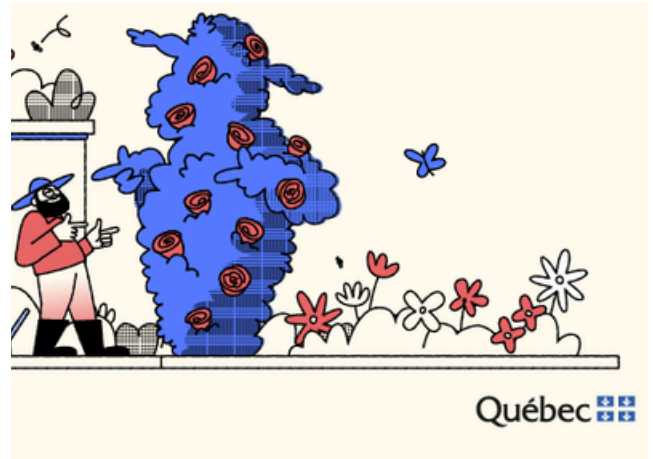
July Plastic-Free Challenge

If you do not have a permit, you can also present your receipt from the boat wash station, which confirms that your boat was washed before being launched.
