This change is being rolled out across Quebec. From now on, producers who put products on the market in Quebec are responsible for their end-of-life management.

The aim is to reduce non-recyclable materials and promote the eco-design of products

What to do with hot ashes?

Improper storage of hot ashes can cause fires and carbon monoxide poisoning. To dispose of your ashes safely, you must :

- regularly empty the ashes from the fireplace, never with a vacuum cleaner, but with a metal shovel;
- place hot ashes in a metal container with a raised bottom and metal lid;
- take the metal container outdoors, as hot ashes give off carbon monoxide;
- place it on a non-combustible surface, at least 1 m away from any object;
- wait at least 7 days before transferring the ashes from the metal container to another container (garbage can, organic matter bin), and stir the ashes to ensure they have cooled completely. If you can, keep the ashes outside all winter, and dispose of them only in spring.



Ice can play tricks on you!

With over 40 lakes, the Township of Wentworth urges residents to stay informed before stepping onto frozen surfaces. Ice color can be a crucial indicator of its thickness and safety:

- Clear, transparent ice: safe when at least 4 inches thick (see the ice thickness chart).
- White or opaque ice: weaker due to air bubbles.
- Grey or dark ice: dangerous, indicating water presence.
